Report on the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **SP MANGAL MURTI ENTERPRISES PRIVATE LIMITED** ("the Company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at March 31, 2025, and the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the **Companies Act, 2013** ('Act') in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2025, its profit or loss for the year ended on that date.

Basis for opinion We conducted our audit in accordance with the standards on auditing specified under section 143 (10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the code of ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the code of ethics.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Key Audit Matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

EMPHASIS OF MATTER:

The Company, **SP Mangal Murti Enterprises Private Limited** is the wholly-owned subsidiary of SRM Contractors Limited as the latter Company holds 99.9% shares in the former Company and since the holding Company is a Public Company then pursuant to proviso of Section 2 (71) of the

Companies Act, 2013, the subsidiary company shall be deemed to be public company for the purposes of this Act even where such subsidiary company continues to be a private company in its articles.

Information other than the financial statements and auditor's report thereon

The Company's board of directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Board's Report including Annexures to Board's Report, Business Responsibility Report but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Management's responsibility for the financial statements

The Company's board of directors are responsible for the matters stated in section 134 (5) of the Act with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the accounting standards specified under section 133 of the Act. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

From the matters communicated with those charged with governance, we determine those matters that were of most significance in the audit of the financial statements of the current period and are therefore the key audit matters. We describe these matters in our auditors' report unless law or regulation precludes public disclosure about the matter or when, in extremely rare circumstances, we determine that a matter should not be communicated in our report because the adverse consequences of doing so would reasonably be expected to outweigh the public interest benefits of such communication.

Report on other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

 - (i) The Company does not have any pending litigations which would impact its financial position.

- (v) The Company has not declared or paid any dividend to its members during the year.
- (vi) The provisions of Section 197(16) of the Act is not applicable to the Company.
- (vii) During our audit, it was observed that the Company uses accounting system that has a comprehensive audit trail feature necessary for documenting and tracking changes to financial data as envisaged under Rule 11(g) of the Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014 and same was operated throughout the year. Further during the course of our audit, we did not come across any event of audit trail being tampered with.

NOTES TO ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED ON 31ST MARCH, 2025

1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

M/S. SP MANGAL MURTI ENTERPRISES PRIVATE LIMITED is a Company registered with the Registrar of Companies, J&K having **CIN: U25999JK2023PTC014318**. The Company is engaged in the business of providing construction related solutions in the field of Highways, Tunnels, Bridges, Roads and other matters related to construction.

ii) Basis of preparation of Financial Statements.

The Financial Statements are prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) to comply in all material respects with the notified Accounting Standards under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with paragraph 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis. The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the Company and are consistent with those used in the previous year except for the change in accounting policies explained below. The complete financial statements have been prepared along with all disclosures.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the criteria set out in Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013. Based on the nature of the products and services and the time between acquisition of assets for processing and their realization in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as twelve months for the purpose of current/non current classification of its assets and liabilities.

iii) Inventories

The Company does not hold any inventory as on 31.03.2025.

iv) Property Plant and Equipment

Property Plant and Equipment are stated at cost less depreciation less accumulated depreciation, if any. For this purpose, cost comprises of cost of acquisition and all costs directly attributable to bringing the asset to the present condition of its intended use. Subsequent expenditures related to an item of fixed assets are added to its gross book value only if it increases the future benefits from the existing asset beyond its previously assessed standard of performance.

Depreciation of Assets has been provided at a pro rata basis for all tangible assets on a Straight-Line Method over the useful life of the assets as prescribed in Schedule II Part-C of the Companies Act, 2013.

As required by Schedule II to the Companies Act 2013, the management has adopted Component Based approach for accounting for fixed assets. Any component of an asset, whose replacement cost exceeds 20% of the total value of the asset, is treated as a "Significant Component" and accounted for separately. Useful Life of the Significant Component for the purpose of depreciation is decided considering estimates of the management and technical experts.

An assessment is done at each Balance Sheet date as to whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such Indication exists, an estimate of the recoverable amount of asset is determined. If the carrying value of relevant asset is higher than the recoverable amount, the carrying

value is written down accordingly. As at 31 March 2024, the management is of the opinion that there is no indication as to impairment of any asset.

(v) Intangible Assets

The company does not hold any Intangible Assets as at the end of the year.

(vi) Investments

The Company has not made investments during the year.

(vii) Provision for Taxation

Provision for Taxation is made on the basis of taxable profits computed for the current accounting period in accordance with the Income Tax Act 1961. Deferred tax resulting from timing differences between book profits and tax profits is accounted for at the current rate of tax or the substantially enacted rate of tax to the extent timing differences are expected to crystallise, in case of deferred tax liabilities with reasonable certainty and in case of deferred tax assets with reasonable certainty that there would be adequate future taxable income against which deferred tax assets can be realised. However, deferred tax asset arising on account of unabsorbed depreciation and business losses are recognised only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that there would be adequate future taxable income against which the same can be realised/ set off.

(viii) Employee Benefits

Employee benefits, like performance incentives and annual bonus and increments expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees are recognized during the period when the same are accrued in favour of the employees. Provision for gratuity has not been made as none of the employees is eligible for the same.

(ix) Share Capital

The company has only one class of equity shares.

(x) Provisions

The Company creates a provision when there is present obligation as a result of a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a realisable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate of the amount required to settle the obligation at the Balance Sheet date. These estimates are reviewed at each Balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate.

A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources. When there is a possible obligation or a present obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

xi) Foreign Currency Translation

The company has no transactions in foreign currency during the year.

xii) Contingent Liabilities

There are no contingent liabilities as at 31 March, 2025.

(xiii) Earnings Per Share

The Company presents basic and diluted earnings per share (EPS) data for its equity shares. Basic EPS is calculated by dividing net profit attributable to equity shareholders of the Company by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

Diluted EPS is determined by adjusting the net profit attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

(xiv) Revenue

Revenue is recognised on the basis of approved contracts regarding the services provided to a customer for an amount that reflects the consideration to which the entity expects to be entitled in exchange of those goods or services.

Rendering of Services

Income from services rendered is recognized at a point in time based on agreements with the customers when the services are performed and there are no unfulfilled obligations.

OTHER INCOME

Other Income is recognized on accrual basis to the extent of its probability of its realization.

(xv) Benami Properties

No proceedings have been initiated on or are pending against the company for holding benami property under the Benami Transactions (Prohibition) Act, 1988 (45 of 1988) and rules made thereunder.

(xvi) Relationship with Struck Off Companies

The company has no transactions with the companies struck off under Section 248 of Act 2013.

(xvii) Registration of Charges or Satisfaction with Registrar of Companies (ROC)

There are no charges or satisfaction yet to be registered with the Registrar of Companies beyond statutory period.

(xviii) Compliance with Number of Layers of companies.

The company does not have any subsidiary as at 31 March 2025.


